THE ROLE OF THE LEGISLATURE, LOBBYIST AND COURT QUASI ROLE-PLAYING THE LEGISLATURE

The state of Beutifica has established a lovely park near Montague High School. The state wishes to preserve some elements of nature, undisturbed by noise, traffic, pollution, and crowding. The purpose behind the park was to provide a place where Beautifica citizens can go and find grass, trees, flowers, and quiet. In addition, there are playgrounds and picnic areas.

The park is situated next to the parking lot at Montague High. In the park there is a "road that leads directly" to the school parking lot. There is also a "road right next to the park" that also leads to the school parking lot. However, it takes ten minutes longer to reach the school parking lot if a student drives on the "road next to the park" instead of "the road that leads directly" to it.

In an effort to sleep in ten minutes longer in the morning, most Montague High students drive on "the road that leads directly" to the school parking lot. When driving on through the park on "the road that leads directly" to the school parking lot, the students' cars make a substantial amount of noise. Also, the students are driving over flowers and shrubs. Citizens using the park are upset.

The sanitation department wants to drive the truck in to collect the trash. 3. Two police cars are chasing a suspected bank robber. If one police car cuts through the park, it can get in front of the suspect's car and trap it between the patrol cars. 4. An ambulance is racing to the hospital with a dying patient. The shortest route is through the park.
- 5. Some of the children who visit the park want to ride their bicycles there.
- 6. Mrs. Thomas wants to take her baby to the park in a stroller.
- 7. A monument is being erected to the town's citizens who died in the Vietnam War. A tank, donated by the government, is to be placed beside the monument.
